ThunderBowl Gifted to CSU Pueblo Foundation


In May, Colorado State University Pueblo Foundation Board of Directors accepted the ThunderBowl, formerly the Neta & Eddie DeRose ThunderBowl and other assets from the Friends of Football — the largest one-time donation in the history of the Foundation.

Constructed in 2008, the ThunderBowl features 6,500 seats, a synthetic turf field, a ten-lane, all-weather track, throwing, jumping, and pole vault areas, as well as a 27,000-square-foot field house. The stadium is also home to the Leomiti Warrior Center, a 10,000-square-foot strength and conditioning complex. The roof of the center features an observation deck providing opportunities for special events and pre-game hospitality.

In addition to being the home of ThunderWolves Football, the ThunderBowl hosts a variety of Colorado High School Activities Association events including football championship games. In 2018, Friends of Football hosted the 2A and 3A Colorado High School Football Championships in the ThunderBowl and during the 2020-21 academic year, all football classifications held their championships at the ThunderRowl.
